



The Government has continued to provide financial support to improve physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. It is for schools to decide how the funding is spent. However, schools are to be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding.

In the academic year 2017/18 Barleyhurst Park Primary School was allocated total funding of £8850.

Impact of Funding
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each class received at least one weekly high energy PE lessons delivered by a sports coach</li> <li>• Improved facilities/equipment for whole school events such as Sports Day.</li> <li>• Increased number of pupils leaving KS2 being water confident. At the beginning of Year 4 50% of the class were considered water confident, by the end of the Spring Term 100% had achieved Water Confidence Level 1, a 50% increase.</li> <li>• 97% of the class also achieved Water Confidence Level 2 and 33% of the class achieved either Water Confidence 3 or Waterman-ship 1.</li> <li>• Increased number of pupils leaving KS2 being able to swim 25 metres. At the beginning of the year only 10% of Year 4 children were able to swim 25 metre, by the end of the Spring Term 43% were able to swim at least 25 metres, an increase of 33%.</li> <li>• 17% of children in Year 4 can swim 50 metres or more. 60% of the class can swim at least 10 metres, an increase of 49% from 20% of the class at the start of the year.</li> <li>• At the end of the summer 2017 Term 76% of Year 4 (current Year 5) were able to swim at least 25 metres.</li> <li>• Improved resources to facilitate delivery of a wider range of sports such as new dodgeball and handball equipment.</li> <li>• Participation in a wide range of competitive sports against other MK schools.</li> <li>• Continued success in the MK small/medium schools' cross country competition.</li> <li>• The school's athletics team came 1<sup>st</sup> in the MK 2017 small schools' athletics competition.</li> </ul>
