- At Barleyhurst Park we consider that being a responsible Citizen encompasses many aspects, one of which is making good choices. Others include learning to behave appropriately, and having respect for others and the environment in which we work and live together.
- As a school, we believe it is important to prepare children for the next stage of their life. There must be a total consistency of expectation that everyone (irrespective of gender, sexuality, race or culture) should feel safe and secure, have empathy and respect for all others, and place a high value upon individual achievement and personal development.
- We foster a positive environment where children exhibit a sense of commitment and pride in the school. We value our parent/carers and feel that collaborative working with them is extremely important. Our key aim is to promote positive behaviours and help the children understand the impact that inappropriate behaviours can have and how to make better informed choices in the future.
