Year 6 Gorillas Newsletter: June 2021




It seems everyone had an enjoyable half term break. Particularly since the weather returned to more familiar May

and June weather. Once more, all pupils have been a real credit to themselves with the way that they have returned to school: positive about their learning, ready to work hard and making good choices.




