Describe how a significant event or person in British history changed or influenced how people live today. *Gods and Mortals	Individual events linked to themes, such as the rise and fall of the monarchy, uprisings and rebellions, great inventions and crime and punishment, all show changes in British life over time. Describe a series of significant events, linked by a common theme, that show changes over time in Britain. *I Am Warrior; Traders and Raiders Anglo-Saxons and Scots from Ireland invaded Britain to fight and capture land and goods because the Romans had left. Anglo-Saxons also wanted to find farmland after flooding in Scandinavia.
