
Welcome back

The Curriculum

<u>English</u>

In English we will be studying 'The Boy in the Striped John Boyne. This will provide the stimulus for lots of our writing work during English lessons. This is a wartime text children will find themselves learning more about their Child's War, whilst developing their key reading and skills.

<u>Maths</u>

To start the year, we will be studying place value to 10 million which will include rounding numbers to any degree of accuracy. We will then be moving on to work based on the 4 operations.

<u>Topic</u>

Our topic for the term is 'A Child's War' and based on events from World War II. Through the study of this significant period, the children will develop their historical, geographical and social understanding.

Elsewhere across the curriculum, we will be learning about 'Animals Including Humans' in Science lessons.

<u> P.E. kit</u>

P.E. lessons will take place every Monday and Wednesday. Always having the correct kit for P.E. is a small way in which pupils can take responsibility. It should be worn to school on each day that Year 6 have P.E. In addition, if they would like to do sport for reward time on a Friday, they should come to school in P.E. kit on a Friday too. If they don't wish to do sport for reward time, then they should wear normal uniform as other non-sporting activities will also be available for them to do.
